The ideal candidate thinks broadly and strategically and is also detail-oriented and organized to inspire and train the team.

This position is a **local** (not expat), **contract** position to end in June 2020, with option to renew pending funding, and to be based initially in Long Xuyen, An Giang Province.

- Oversee the documentation and reporting of program implementation, databases, preparation, and submission of periodic and final program reports
- Produce annual planning documents with budget, goals, deliverables for programs
- Design programs to respond to funding opportunities

- Set up workflows for program implementation, record keeping, and financial controls
- Support the liaising and negotiating partnerships with counterparts for smooth program implementation
- Organize logistics to support and train the corps of volunteers to support program activities

- Implement performance reviews, training plan for team members for operation consistency in standards/protocols
- Be an integral part of the fundraising and advocacy team
